- Always use the printer in a well ventilated area. Do not block the slots and opening on the unit, which are provided for ventilation.
- Only use the power source indicated on the rating label.
- Use only the power cord that comes with the unit.
- Do not place anything on the power cord.

1 Introduction

Thank you for purchasing the BradyPrinter i3300, which you can use to create and print professional-looking industrial labels and signs. All you have to do is:

- Drop in a ribbon cartridge. You can choose from a wide range of single-color ribbons.
- Drop in a label cartridge. You can choose widths that range from 0.25 in. to 4 in. (6.4 mm to 101.6 mm), and come in many colors, styles, and materials.
- Send labels for printing from your labeling software.

Labels and ribbons from Brady Corporation are programmed with the ability to communicate with the printer and software. This allows you to gain the full benefit of the system.

Features and Functions

The following are just some of the features that make this system so easy to use and ready to meet your label-making requirements:

- Small, lightweight (approximately 11.5 lbs [5.2 kg]) unit, ready for your desktop.
- · Color touch screen LCD display input.
- Single-color job printing at 300 DPI, up to 4 in. (101.6 mm) wide and up to 60 in. (1.5 m) long.
- · Wide variety of ribbon colors.
- Easy loading label and ribbon supplies.
- Continuous and die-cut label supplies in a variety of high-performance materials.
- Transfer graphics from PC or USB flash drive. Supported graphic formats are Windows metafile (*.wmf), Bitmap (*.bmp), JPG file (*.jpg), Graphic Interchange Format (*.gif) and Portable Network Graphics (*.png).
- Print labels from PC.
- Automatic cutter.

Compatible Applications

The BradyPrinter i3300 is compatible with Brady[®] Workstation desktop software.

When used with Brady Workstation software, the printer will automatically recognize all enabled and compatible materials up to 4 in. (101.6 mm) wide. For operation of the printer with other software, refer to the documentation for your application.

Note: Only BradyPrinter i3300 supplies will work with this printer.

Button Actions

There are three physical buttons on the front of the printer. Their function is described below.

- The power button turns the printer on/off and is also used for sleep mode (see page 6).
- The feed button advances the label. See page 23 for more information.
- The cut button allows you to manually cut the label.

2 Setup

Unpacking and Setting up Printer

Carefully unpack and inspect the printer surfaces (interior and exterior) and the labeling system for possible damage during shipping.

Note: Be sure to remove any transportation protection from around the print head and inside the enclosure cover.






Figure 2-1. Printer Components


Note: The printer is equipped with a universal power supply and can be operated with a voltage of 100 to 240 V~, 50- to 60 Hz. The printer senses the voltage type and automatically adjusts for the power source.

Power

Setup

- 1. Plug the power cord into the printer at the location shown.
- 2. Plug the other end of the power cord into an AC power outlet.
- 3. Turn the power switch on. The printer turns on and displays the Home page. The size and color of the currently installed supplies and other status indicators are shown.

Note: If there is no ribbon or labels installed, the system defaults to black ribbon and 4 inch [101.6 mm] wide continuous white labels.



Power Save Mode

When the printer is plugged in, you can leave it in a state of readiness all the time so that software can find the printer. Or you can choose to conserve power so that the printer automatically turns off after a period of inactivity.

- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. Tap Settings
- 3. Press System Configuration > Power Save Mode.
- 4. Choose AC Power.
- 5. Slide the time indicator dot left (decrease) or right (increase) for the amount of inactive time that can elapse before the printer automatically shuts down. Alternatively you can press the minus (-) button to decrease or the plus (+) button to increase the time.
- 6. Tap to return to the home screen.

Put the Printer into Sleep Mode

When the system is asleep the display turns off and the system goes into a low power consumption state but does not require a cold start to turn back on. In this state, you can either touch the screen or press the power button to return the system to the same state it was in before going into lower power consumption mode. When the printer is in sleep mode the power button is lit green.

Note: To fully shut down the printer press and hold the power button for longer than two seconds.

- 1. With the printer on, press and hold \circlearrowleft for approximately two seconds.
- 2. If there are unsaved changes in the currently active file, you will be prompted to save the current label file.

Wake the Printer from Sleep Mode

If you do not touch the screen or keypad for a defined period of time, the system turns off the display and goes into a low-power consumption mode. When in Sleep Mode, the power button is lit green. The current label and settings are retained.

- 1. Press \bullet or touch the screen.
- 2. Continue with your label activities.


Reboot the Printer

Use this procedure to reboot the printer.

- 1. Press and hold \circlearrowleft for at least 5 seconds. The system performs the initialization process and starts the printer.
- 2. When the *Home* page displays, you can continue with your label activities.

- 10. Close and latch print head door, then close enclosure cover.
- 11. If printer was asleep, press \circlearrowleft . The system detects the installed supplies, sets background and foreground colors, indicates the label dimensions and the amount of remaining supplies.

Recycling the Label and Ribbon Cartridges

Cartridges need to be recycled in accordance with local regulations. Before recycling, the used cartridges must be pulled apart to release the individual components which then must be recycled in the correct recycling bins.

Materials Required:

- 9/32- inch blade or 1/4-inch blade (ribbon) and 5/32- inch blade (label) flathead screwdrivers
- Safety Glasses
- · Safety Gloves



CAUTION! Always wear Person Protective Equipment (PPE) when dismantling a cartridge.

Dismantling the Ribbon Cartridge


1. Using your thumbnail or the blade of the screwdriver, apply pressure to push the clear plastic locking tabs up until the cartridge unlocks.



- 2. Insert the blade of the screwdriver next to each tab along the seam of the two halves of the cartridge and gently pry apart the halves.
 - Repeat this process on both sides of the cartridge until all tabs are disconnected and the cartridge opens.
- 3. Slide the smart cell out of its location slot.
- 4. Unwind the ribbon from the spools and peel the ribbon end from the cardboard cores.
- 5. Remove the ribbon spools from the center of the cardboard core.



Dismantling the Label Cartridge

- Using your thumbs, simultaneously apply pressure to the release tabs while pushing the center cylinder forward until the tabs release and unlock the center cylinder.
- 2. Pull the loose cylinder free from the label cartridge.
- 3. Using the screwdriver, place the blade in the gap next to the **smart cell holder** and pry the holder from the cylinder.
- 4. Remove the smart cell from the plastic holder.





Release Tabs

- 5. Push the screwdriver blade between the flat cartridge guides and **locking end cap**. Twist the screwdriver and continue this process around the end cap until comes off.
- 6. Repeat this process on the other side of the cartridge.
- 7. Remove the cardboard tube by pushing the center core out from the tube or by cutting the tube off of the core.

Connecting the Printer

Connect to a computer in one or both of the following ways:

- On a network. This method allows multiple computers to send label files to the printer.
- Directly with a USB cable. See Configuring a Direct USB Connection" on page 16.

Configuring the Printer for Network Communication

The printer has two network controllers - one for Ethernet (wired) and one for Wi-Fi. These two controllers act independently and can simultaneously receive data.

Note: Wi-Fi capability is not available on all printers or in all countries.

You can set up the printer for network communication using:

- An Ethernet connection. Use this option for a wired network.
- A Wi-Fi connection. See Wi-Fi" on page 15.

Configuring an Ethernet Connection



- 1. On the Home screen tap Settings.
- 2. On the Settings screen, select Connection.
- 3. Select Advanced Network Settings on the Connection screen.
- 4. Touch Ethernet.
- 5. Choose IP Settings.
- 6. For IP Settings, select either the DHCP or Static check box.
 - **DHCP**: DHCP addressing is dynamic and the system uses a DNS server to obtain the printer IP address for you.
 - Static: For static addressing, you must supply the printer's IP address.
- 7. If Static was selected, fill in the following fields:
 - IP Address: Enter the printer's IP address.
 - Subnet Mask: Enter a subnet mask if you are using one.
 - Default Gateway: Enter the IP address of the default gateway.
 - DNS Server (Primary): Enter the IP address of the primary DNS server.
 - DNS Server (Secondary): Enter the IP address of the secondary DNS server.

IMPORTANT! If no DNS server is being used, enter 0.0.0.0

- 8. Tap on the **back button** to get to the *Advanced Network Settings* screen in order for the fields entered to take effect.
- 9. If DHCP was selected, no additional fields need to be entered.

Wi-Fi

Connect to a Wi-Fi network either by searching for and selecting a network or by manually entering the network settings. Once connected, the printer can communicate with devices on that network. Devices can only communicate with the printer using either Brady Workstation software.

Search to Connect

To connect to a Wi-Fi wireless network:

- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. Tap **Settings**.
- 3. On the Settings screen, select Connection.
- 4. Tap **Wi-Fi Network** to turn on Wi-Fi and choose a network from the list. If needed, the printer displays a key pad for entering the password.

If the network that you wish to connect to is not in the list, the network may be hidden. Use the steps in the following section to manually enter network settings.

Manually Enter Settings

Use this method for networks that are hidden.

To connect to a Wi-Fi wireless network:

- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. Tap **Settings**.
- 3. On the Settings screen, select Connection.
- 4. Tap Advanced Network Settings.
- 5. Select Wi-Fi from the list.
- 6. Tap **IP Settings** and then tap one of the following.
 - DHCP: DHCP addressing is dynamic and the system uses a DNS server to obtain the printer IP address for you.
 - Static: Select static addressing to manually enter the printer's IP address.
- 7. Tap the back button to return to the *Network* screen. Get assistance from your network administrator for the remaining steps.
- 8. If you chose *DHCP*, configure the following settings.
 - a. Tap **DNS Server (Primary)** to display a keypad and then type the IP address of the DNS server. Tap when finished.
 - b. Tap **DNS Server (Secondary)** and enter the IP address of the secondary DNS server.

- 9. If you chose *Static* in step 6, configure the following settings.
 - Tap IP Address to display a keypad and then type the IP address of the printer. Tap the enter button when finished.
 - b. Tap **Subnet Mask** and enter a subnet mask if you are using one.
 - c. Tap **Default Gateway** to enter the default gateway.
- 10. Tap to return to the Home screen.

Configuring Other Networks

Configuration for personal or enterprise networks.

- 1. Touch the **Menu** button at the top of the *Home* screen.
- 2. Tap **Settings**.
- 3. On the Settings screen, select Connection.
- 4. Tap Wi-Fi Network on the Connection screen.
 - If Wi-Fi is disabled, check the box next to Enabled and wait for the Network list to populate.
- 5. Scroll to the bottom of the list of available networks and select **Other**.
- 6. On the *Other Networks* screen, choose Personal or Enterprise network and fill in the necessary details.
- 7. Tap when finished.

Configuring a Direct USB Connection

To communicate directly with a USB cable, you will need the USB device driver installed on your PC. Once connected, the computer should automatically detect and install the USB driver, if it is not already installed.

- 1. Attach the USB cable to the printer and computer.
- 2. Turn the printer on.
 - On the computer, "Found New Hardware" pops up in the lower right corner of the screen and the print driver wizard is launched.
- 3. In the wizard, click **Install the software automatically** (if it is not already selected).
- 4. Click Next.
 - The print driver installs. This takes a minute or two.
- 5. When complete, in the wizard, click **Finish**.

The BradyPrinter i3300 is now available to receive information from your computer labeling program.

When printing from the computer, the printer must be attached to it via the USB cable. Be sure to select the BradyPrinter i3300 in the print dialog box of the labeling program.



Setting System Defaults

Default values are common settings that are pre-assigned to make the system usable as soon as power is applied (for example, date and time are set to your local date and time). By changing the defaults, you can set the settings to your specific requirements.

Defaults set here will stay in effect even when power is removed from the printer and during upgrades.

To configure or change any of these settings:

- 1. Make sure the printer is turned on.
- 2. Tap Settings
- 3. Select System Configuration.
- 4. Choose the setting to change.
 - Language
 - Select the desired language for messages displayed by the printer.
 - Measurement Units
 - Inches or Millimeters
 - Date and Time
 - Power Save Mode (see page 5)

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Creating Labels

Create label files using Brady Workstation software. When you first create a label file, you specify the printer. This allows the software to provide features specific to your printer. Also, the software automatically detects the ribbon and labels installed in the printer.

For help using the software, refer to the documentation within the software.

Print Adjustments

As you print labels, keep the following in mind:

- The printer cuts between labels or at the end of the job, according to the selected cut settings.
- If there is no labels or ribbon installed, printing does not start and you will be prompted to install the supplies.
- If you open the print head door during the print operation, printing stops and a message displays prompting you to close the module. The print job is canceled. To print the labels, you must restart the print job.

These settings will be used on all print jobs. If you want to change them in a single job, be sure to reset to the default settings when you are done.

To set any of the following six settings, start by:



- 1. On the *Home* screen tap **Settings**.
- 2. Select Print Adjustments. 3. Select the desired print adjustment.

Note: The Reset Default button sets the printer back to factory defaults.

Print Energy

Use the slider to adjust for darker or lighter printing. Print a label to test the setting.

The print energy setting defines how much heat is applied to the print head when printing a label. The darker the print energy, the more ink is transferred to the label. Optimal print energy settings are set automatically by the smart cell for the installed media and should only be changed if you are experiencing problems. For example, if printing is spotty you may want to increase the print energy to make sure more of the ribbon ink transfers to the label. However, if your ribbon is sticking or tearing during printing, the heat energy may be too high and should be reduced.



CAUTION! Constantly printing at high energy levels may cause printer jams or other printing errors and may reduce the overall life of your print head.

Note: The selected print energy setting will stay in effect for all subsequent print jobs with the currently installed media. When new media is installed, the print energy level is reset to the default setting. The print energy level is also reset by rebooting the system.

Horizontal Offset

Use the slider to the image (printed portion of the label) to the right or left. The number shown on the slider indicates how much the beginning print position will shift relative to the factory setting; it does *not* represent the distance from the left edge of the label.

Vertical Offset

Use the slider to shift print up or down on the labels. The number shown on the slider indicates how much the beginning print position will shift relative to the factory setting; it does *not* represent the distance from the top edge of the label.

Print Speed

Print speed lets you adjust the speed setting from 1 to 4 inches per second (ips). Optimal print speed settings are set automatically by the smart cell for the installed supply and should only be changed if you are experiencing problems. For example, you can change print speed if you want to print graphics or other densely populated labels more slowly to ensure complete coverage.

Use the slider to increase or decrease the speed.

Note: The selected print speed setting will stay in effect for all subsequent print jobs with the currently installed supply. When new supply is installed, the print speed is reset to the default setting. The print speed level is also reset by rebooting the system.

Cutting Options

Use this setting to set the cut location. Depending on the selected cut settings, the printer advances the label to tear/cut between labels, at the end of the job, or never. If no setting is used, the default will be the cut location set in Brady Workstation.


Note: The label size for die-cut labels is already set and cannot be adjusted.

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Mirror Print

Starting Position

Print labels suitable for reading in a mirror or through the back of the label.

External Hardware

To connect an external keyboard:

- 1. Plug the keyboard's USB cable into the USB port on the printer.
- 2. On the *Home* screen tap **Settings**.
- 3. Select External Hardware.
- 4. Select **USB Keyboard** then choose the appropriate type of keyboard from the list.

Printing Labels

You must have labeling software installed on your computer to create, edit or print labels. Refer to your labeling software documentation for instructions about installing and using the software. See "Compatible Applications" on page 2 for more details.

Feeding and Cutting Label Stock

If you install label supply that has a roughly cut front edge, it is best to feed and cut the label. Also, feed and cut if you have a partially printed job that you need to remove from within the printer.

To feed and/or cut label stock:

1. With the printer power on, press the **Feed** button repeatedly until the length of supply you want exits the printer.

Note: For die-cut labels, the supply advances to the cut position which is the next die-cut label. For continuous labels, the supply advances two inches each time you press the Feed button.

2. If desired, press **Cut** button. The printer will cut off the label.

Printing Two-sided Sleeve Material

When printing two-sided sleeve material, side one is loaded and printed directly from the roll. To print side two, the material is cut at the end of the job, then the printed strip of sleeves is loaded from the back of the printer for the second print pass.

A supply bridge holds the two-sided material above the tape roll. The two-sided material lays across the bridge to enter the tape entrance ramp. When done, the bridge is raised and snaps into the enclosure cover.


- 1. Print side one of the two-sided markers.
- 2. When the job is done, cut the printed markers.

Note: Use scissors or auto-cutter to cut the markers.

- 3. Open the enclosure cover and print head door.
- 4. Pull the leading edge of the supply backward out of the guides towards the roll, but do not remove the roll itself.


Note: The roll must remain in the supply slot or the printer will indicate a tape out condition.

5. Flip the supply bridge down so it lays over the roll.

- 6. From the back of the printer, feed the leading edge of the PRINTED strip of sleeves through the slot between the enclosure cover and the printer body:
 - Note that the leading edge is the first sleeve in your print sequence.
 - · Be sure the printed side is facing DOWN.
- 7. Lay the markers over the supply bridge and feed the markers to the top of the black roller approximately one quarter inch (6.35 mm) from the exit.
- 8. Close the print head door and the enclosure cover and print side two of the markers.
- 9. When the job is complete, open the enclosure cover and print head door.
- 10. Lift the supply bridge up and snap into place on the enclosure cover.
- 11. Close the enclosure cover.

4 Using System Tools

Graphics & Fonts

Import

To import graphics and fonts from a computer to the printer, first transfer the files to a USB flash drive. Then follow these steps:

- 1. Connect the USB flash drive to any available USB port on the printer.
- 2. On the Home screen, tap Import Files.
- 3. On the *Import Files from USB* screen, select **fonts** or **graphics**.
- 4. On the *Import Fonts/Graphics* screen, select the desired fonts/graphics to import to the printer or use the Select All button.
- 5. Press Import .

A progress bar will display while the import is taking place.

Note: If the system memory has run out of room an out of memory message will display.

Delete

To delete graphics and fonts imported to the printer, follow these steps:

- 1. On the *Home* screen select **File Manager**.
- 2. Choose Fonts or Graphics.
- 3. Select the check box next to specific fonts or graphics to delete or choose the Select All button at the bottom of the screen.

If you know the name of the font or graphic, press \(\bigsize{4} \) to search for it.

- 4. Touch the desired option for sorting.
- 5. Review your selections and press the Delete button.

Installing Firmware Upgrades

To upgrade firmware:



CAUTION! Do not interrupt printer power during an upgrade.

- 1. On a computer, go to www.bradyid.com.
- 2. Point to **Help** and then, under the *Downloads* heading, click **Firmware**.
- 3. Find the most recent BradyPrinter i3300 firmware upgrade in the list and click it. You can sort the list alphabetically to make it easier to find the printer model.
- 4. Click Begin Download.
- 5. Save the downloaded file to a USB flash drive.
- 6. Connect the USB flash drive to any available USB port on the printer. The printer recognizes the upgrade file and displays a message on the touch screen.
- 7. Follow the instructions on the touch screen. When the upgrade is complete, the printer restarts.

Cleaning the Printer

Cleaning Residue from Printer

Whenever performing any maintenance on the printer, you should also clean any residue caused by the labels.

Materials Required:

- Compressed Air Bottle, purchased locally (e.g., HOSA AIR-464 Gear Duster)
- · Lint-free Cloth
- Isopropyl Alcohol
- Safety Glasses



CAUTION! Always wear safety glasses when using compressed air.

- 1. Remove power and supplies from the printer (see Pre-maintenance Operations" on page 27).
- 2. With safety glasses on, spray compressed air on any parts of the printer that have built-up residue.

Note: If compressed air is not available, use a lint-free cloth lightly moistened with isopropyl alcohol and wipe off residue.

- 3. Replace the ribbon and labels.
- 4. Close all covers and plug in the power cord.




Cleaning the Sensors

The supply and cutter sensors are located inside the printer and may be covered with dust that results from cutting the labels. One of the supply sensors is located under the yellow supply guide, as shown in the picture below. The cutter sensor is located above the cutting blade and is visible only when the cutter is released.

Materials Required

- BradyPrinter i3300 Cleaning Kit (Cat # B31-CCT)
- Isopropyl Alcohol
- 1. Remove power and supplies from the printer (see Pre-maintenance Operations" on page 27).
- 2. Squeeze the two yellow cutter tabs to release the cutter; the cutter mechanism and exit chute will slide down exposing the cutter sensor.
- 3. With a pre-moistened foam swab, gently wipe the surface of the cutter sensor [11] and the two supply sensors [10] at the locations shown:
 - a. Center die-cut sensor [10a]
 - b. Label out/die-cut sensor [10b]






